Chances are good that, at some time in your life, you've taken a time management class, read about <u>it</u> in books, and tried to use an electronic or paper-based day planner to organize, prioritize and **schedule** your day. "Why, with this knowledge and these **gadgets**," you may ask, "do I still feel like I can't get everything done I need to?"

The answer is simple. Everything <u>you</u> ever learned about managing time is a complete waste of time because <u>it</u> doesn't work. Before you can even begin to manage time, you must learn what time is. A dictionary defines time as "the point or period at which things occur." Put simply, time is when stuff happens.

There are two types of time: clock time and real time. In clock time, there are <u>60</u> seconds in a minute, 60 minutes in an hour, <u>24</u> hours in a day and <u>365</u> days in a year. All time passes equally. When someone turns 50, <u>they</u> are exactly 50 years old, no more or no less. In real time, all time is relative. Time flies or drags depending on what you're doing. Two hours at the department of motor vehicles can feel like 12 years. And yet our 12-year-old children **seem** to have grown up in only two hours.
